Birthday "Party Basket" Desserts



By BETTY BARCLAY

A new way to decorate rennet-custards for a children's party is to use your pastry tube for making initials or numerals to indicate birthdays — or even funny clown faces. Assorted gumdrops too, are an ideal way to make initialed desserts for party guests. Use them to top delicious rennet-custards served in a novel basket serving dish. They are pretty and "ice creamy" desserts for any age. Directions for making "Party Baskets" are given below the recipe for "Birthday Rennet-Custards."

Birthday Rennet-Custards

- 2 cups milk (not canned)
- 1 pkg. raspberry rennet powder
- Assorted gumdrops

Make 4 party baskets for custard cups following directions given.

Warm milk slowly to lukewarm, not hot (110°F). Test a drop from spoon on inside of wrist, as you would test milk in baby's bottle. Then remove from heat at once. Empty package contents into milk — stir until dissolved, not over one minute. Pour

at once while still liquid. Let set undisturbed 10 minutes until firm. Then chill. Decorate rennet desserts just before serving with gumdrop initials for each birthday guest.

Party Baskets: From colored crepe paper, cut strips long enough to fit around custard cups. Strips should be about 1/4" higher than custard cup. To make handle, fasten a curved pipe cleaner to custard cup, using cellophane tape. Wrap crepe paper around custard cup, fastening with cellophane tape.


