THE NEGRO IN POLITICS.

The patriotic St. Augustine convention on the distribution of the honest bits of Federal pie was slightly spoiled by the pastry cook in burning the crust a very dark brown, but as the crust gets nothing it really doesn't matter. There can be but little doubt that the state of Florida will be a Republican by a handsome majority of about 12 far pies, and the dark brown crust will still remain on the outside; still it makes a beautiful frieze for the filling. Great advancement is needed in the republican party making in Florida. —Times-Union and Citizen.

The political sagacity and astute democratic brain of the Times-Union knows just how, where and when to tickle the fancy of a class of white Republicans in Florida who are terribly warped in their ideas of party segregation.

The editor-in-chief of the Times-Union and Citizen, Mr. Geo. W. Wilson, and every white Republican in the state, who are waiting for a realization of their imaginations when the colored man will voluntarily quit or be eliminated from politics, they will wait until the beginning of the next millennium.

As the Times-Union facetiously remarks: "The patriotic St. Augustine convention on the distribution of toothsome bits of Federal pie, was slightly spoiled by the pastry cook in burning the crust a very dark brown, but as the crust gets nothing it really does not matter." This statement even from a white democratic paper testifies to the loyalty and patriotism of the Negro to the political party of his choice.

That sort of loyalty evidences in the Negro the highest order of citizenship when he is willing to serve his party without pay and the hope of reward.

It was a magnificent recognition by the St. Augustine convention when its white delegates as well as black unanimously elected Joseph E. Lee and M. S. White delegates at large to the National Republican Convention. Then, too, this sort of thing appears to be the desire of the administration and leading members of the National Republican Committee, namely "Colored men must be recognized." It's politics and good politics at that. It's American politics, german to and growing out of the fundamental principles of our political institutions. White republicans who come from the North with honest motives to make Florida their home and invest their means in the development of the State's resources, make the mistake of their lives when they go about to revolutionize affairs in their par-

ty. They are, in all probability unconsciously prompted to begin a political warfare on the Negro through social alliances with their southern white neighbors, and when the warfare begins, they seek democratic newspapers in order to give full publicity to their political child like sullen natures, while southern Democrats are having a good time laughing in their sleeves at the forlorn hope of the "yankee republicans."

Here is a sample of those who want the Negroes eliminated from politics, taken from the Kissimmee Valley Gazette, published in South Florida and we presume, republican in politics: "As for those adopted citizens who were Republicans before they came here, many of them came from States which are not plagued by the race question, and they affiliate with the Democrats here because they cannot stomach the negro."

"There two controlling causes of the weakness of the Republicans. One is the dominance of the negro element, and the other is the selfishness of the party leaders. The first not only weakens the party, but strengthens the Democrats. Nothing would hurt the Democratic party more than to expel the negro from the Republican party. It would deprive the Democrats of their winning big bear and it would heal the discord between the two wings of the Republican party. The second cause was pointed out last week by the Miami Metropolis, whose Republican proprietors have lately sold out. The truth is the Republican party is nothing more than an employment bureau for a handful of office hacks, who keep up the form of an organization for the sake of distributing the federal patronage. They don't wait to strengthen the party. Converts would mean fresh mouths for pie and they don't want any rivals in the pie eating business. Principles they care nothing for; and their platforms are a farce, consisting mainly of fulsome laudation of the chief pie baker and patron."

"The sympathy of all Democrats should go out to those patriotic Republicans who are trying to drag the party out of the greedy clutches of the professional pie flenders, and out of the black shadow in which it lurks into the daylight of a white man's government." To intelligent southern white men and colored too, the above is but the emissions of a prejudiced mind.

STATE ITEMS

Orl. Forest Picked and Cultured From Our Exchanges.

J. M. Chemy of Orlando is the State Census supervisor of the 2nd Congressional district of Florida. Perhaps it is not fully known how many enumeration districts to which enumerators will be appointed; it is hoped that colored men of the second district will be fairly recognized.

Dr. L. W. Livingston, U. S. Consul to Cape Haytien, is in Jacksonville the guest of Dr. A. W. Smith. He will return to his post of duty on or about the 1st of the month. Consul Livingston represents the intellectual side of the younger colored men of the State, in himself a native Floridian, partly educated in the state and holding so important a position abroad makes him the foremost colored man in the state.

The annual conference of the Independent African Methodist Episcopal Church met in their third annual session, in Jasper last Thursday, and adjourned last night. Bishop J. J. Sawyer, of this city, presided, having as his associate Bishop G. W. Lomax, of the South Carolina conference. Rev. R. D. Phillips, of Madison, was secretary.

FLORIDA REPUBLICANS.

THE WHITE AND TWO COLORED DELEGATES TO PHILADELPHIA

The Republican State Convention of Florida, met at noon in St. Augustine, January 19th for the purpose of electing four delegates at large to the National Republican convention, which meets in Philadelphia on the 19th of June, next.

At noon the convention was called to order by H. S. Chubb, Receiver of Public Monies U. S. Land office, Gainesville and chairman of the Republican State Central Committee; Rev. T. A. Glynn offered prayer. Nearly every county in the state was represented, making one of the largest conventions held in the state for many years.

Joseph E. Lee, secretary of the state committee was next introduced. He read the official call for the convention, giving in detail the exact object of the meeting, to elect four delegates to the Republican national convention and also to elect four alternates. The temporary roll was next called by W. H. Chandler of Ocala, who was called upon by the chair to assist the secretary.

The delegates then went into the election of a temporary chairman for the convention, and Hon. John G. Long was elected to the office by acclamation. After being escorted to the stage, he spoke at length upon the good work of the administration and party.

Upon motion, a committee of nine was appointed by the chair on credentials, after which the convention adjourned until 3:30 o'clock to hear the committee's report. The chair named the following delegates to serve on the committee: Messrs. Horr, Lucas, Page, White, Moore, Fleming, Root, Turner and Rush.

DELEGATES CHOSEN.

The committee on credentials remained in session until after dark. The convention reassembled soon after 7 o'clock to act upon the report, which recommended that both the delegations from Hillsboro, Pasco and Manatee contesting delegates be not seated. The report was adopted. The committee proceeded to other business.

PERMANENT ORGANIZATION.

The temporary organization was made permanent permanent with J. E. Lee secretary.

A committee on nomination of four delegates and four alternates was appointed. Among them General R. L. Scarlett, W. G. Robinson and J. W. Howell. This committee made the following report: Delegates to the national convention, Judge G. Long, Joseph E. Lee, Henry S. Chubb and Mark S. White. Alternates: R. L. Scarlett, John E. Horr, A. Purdee, and Dr. P. N. Richardson.

Mr. Chubb was re-elected chairman of the State committee.

On adjournment of the State convention the Second Congressional district convention was called to order by Walter G. Robinson. The delegates elected by this convention were: W. G. Robinson of Gainesville and H. W. Chandler of Ocala.

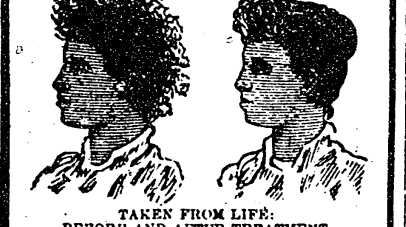
